## Senior Options

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## The Senior Year

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Upon completion of a student's junior year at Sollers Point Technical High School, students who have met their completer status and meet the qualifications could be eligible to participate in the senior options program through the Career Connections department.

## Capstone Work Experience

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The Capstone Work Experience (CWE), is a popular option that allows students to enter the workforce during their senior year.

Students are employed in their technical field and work a minimum of ten hours per week. Hours worked are documented, verified by their employer, and reported biweekly.

Each quarter, students are evaluated by their employer and Career Connections Coordinator on workplace competencies pertaining to their workplace responsibilities and duties, etc.

Benefits of the Capstone Work Experience are students gaining additional experience in their technical field, building their resume, networking with people in the industry and learning what it takes to advance in the field. Students often are offered full time employment upon graduation.



## College Pathways

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Students may choose to enroll and register for college courses at the Community College of Baltimore County (CCBC). Depending upon qualifications, students may be eligible to participate in the College4Free program. For a student to be eligible for College4Free, they must take the Accuplacer and place college ready in reading and writing. Additionally, students must have a GPA of 2.5 to be eligible.

All students are eligible to participate in the Parallel Enrollment Program (PEP) at CCBC. Students participating in the PEP receive a 50% reduction on tuition.

Students must be registered for a minimum of six credits for both the fall and spring semesters in order to meet the senior option criteria.
